



The International Perspective



I met Mr. Aditya Singh about half way through his studies here at the UOTP. Aditya has the vision, drive and intellect to accomplish great things going forward and I know he will. Aditya will graduate in June, 2017 and I hope he will continue to work with the university alumni association. I had an opportunity to sit down with Aditya for a brief interview last week and the conversation went like this:

Dr. Kimble: Mr. Singh, what is it like being an international student?

Mr. Singh: The Student experience is the single most influential factor, college is nothing like you ever imagined it to be, it's so much better. You don't know this yet, but you are/will be going through dramatic changes that will shape you into adulthood. You will encounter experiences and people that will cause you incredible joy, pain, deep sadness, and unimaginable blessings. You will be transformed into a new person from the time you enter the university until the time you walk across the stage to receive your graduate degree and beyond.

Dr. Kimble: How would you advise a new student on finding a place to live?

Off-campus accommodation is the best option for international students, as it gives them a chance to explore the American lifestyle closely. This involves:

- Finding an accommodation which is close to public transportation
- Finding good roommates
- Typically, it costs \$2100 for 3 Bedroom apartment, \$1900 for 2, \$1600 for 1
- Facebook is the best place to find accommodation, type the city and area, you will find plenty of groups and pricing/roommates
- Having a car is a good thing but it does cost you \$150-\$300 per month (Insurance/Tax/Registration)

Dr. Kimble: Many students are seeking jobs, any words of wisdom for them?

Mr. Singh: First, you could apply for a part-time job at your university while obtaining your degree. Second, if you want to do Internships/Part-time, you have to apply for CPT (Curricular Practical Training). CPT is work authorization while a student is still in school. Finally, OPT, allow you to work legally in the states for 12 months after completing of degree. If you are a STEM major, you are entitled to additional 24 months to your original 12 months (36 months in total)


Steps to attain employment in The United States:

- Get appropriate skills. Certifications are a great way to give you an edge over your competitors
- Network, Network (It's all about connections)
- Make an impressive resume and cover letter
- Updated LinkedIn Profile/ Social Platforms
- Apply to companies/ Recruiters
